در این برنامه سند پالیسی در مورد مسیر آینده زنان افغان که توسط شبکه زنان افغان تهیه شده است توسط روبینا همدرد مسوول دادخواهی این شبکه توضیح شد. در ادامه بحث روی وضعیت زنان و سند پالیسی یاد شده توسط اعضای هیئت منصفه هر یک سلامت عظیمی وزیر مبارزه علیه مواد مخدر، شینکی ذهین کروخیل نماینده مردم در پارلمان، حبیبه سرابی مشاور امور زنان و جوانان ریاست اجرائیه ومعاون شورای عالی صلح، شاه گل رضایی نماینده مردم در پالمان، با تسهیل کننده سمیرا حمیدی عضو هیئت مدیره شبکه زنان افغان صورت گرفت. همچنان به پاس زحمات شایان کارمندان شبکه زنان افغان اعضای هیئت مدیره ای دور قبل این شبکه از آنان با تقدیم تحسین نامه ها ستایش کردند. در پایان برنامه با جمع بندی توسط روشن مشعل مسوول بخش هماهنگی شبکه زنان افغان انجام یافت.



به بهانه ای روز جهانی زن

هشتم مارچ مصادف به روز جهانی زن است، روز که زنان کران تا کران باهم جمع می شوند، و برای تحقق خواستهای برحق وعادلانه شان برضد انواع ظلم، تبعیض و بهره کشی ها میثاق نبرد خویش را در این روز تجدید و تازه مینمایند. تظاهرات، راه پیمایی ها، سخنرانی ها و مجالس گوناگون برپا میدارند و بودن خود را در روی کره زمین به اثبات میرسانند. این روز را یونسکو در سال ۱۹۷۷ به عنوان روز جهانی زن به رسمیت شناخت.

روز همبستگی زنان در افغانستان نیز همه ساله تجلیل به عمل می آید، و امسال نیز با برنامه های ویژه پی از سوی نهادهای دولتی و غیر دولتی تجلیل گردید؛ که یاد آور دستاوردها، چالش ها و مشکلات زنان در افغانستان بوده است. زنان کشور از محروم ترین و آسیب پذیرترین قشر جامعه هستند. آنان نمادی از ظلم و حقارت به شمار می روند که همیشه مورد توهین، تحقیر و خشونت قرار گرفته اند. مشکلات بی شماری از جمله عدم دسترسی زنان به آموزش و پرورش، خدمات صحی، عدم خود کفایی آنان از لحاظ اقتصادی، خشونت های روز افزون و سایر مسایل اجتماعی فراروی زنان این سرزمین وجود دارد؛ و آنچه آنان را از حقوق شان بدور نگه داشته است شرایط نامساعد و سابقه ی مردسالاری، بی سوادی و موجودیت فرهنگ های خرافات است.

با این همه زنان افغانستان هر روز از روزگار را امیدی برای روشنایی و فردای بهتر می شمارند، و خویش را نیرومند از پیش میدانند. حضور و افزایش آنان در موقف های کلیدی نهادهای دولتی و سایر دستاوردها گواه بر قوت ایشان و آینده مثبت می دهد. نقش دهی زنان در تصمیم گیری ها و اجتماع با حمایت از دولت آنان را متقاعد برای مبارزه با چالش های موجود در برابر ایشان می سازد، و نیز از حقوق اساسی خویش آگاه شده دیگر دست به خود سانسوری نمی زنند. تلاش ها برای رشد و توانمند ساختن زنان هم از سوی نهادهای دولتی و غیر دولتی صورت گرفته است؛ اما بسنده نبوده نیاز بیشتر برای حمایت و توانمندی در عرصه مشارکت اجتماعی و سیاسی زنان در جامعه افغانستان و دسترسی آنان به عدالت محسوس است؛ تا به خود سازی، خود کفایی، و خود ارادیت برسند.

از هشتم مارچ روز همبستگی زنان در حالی در افغانستان تجلیل به عمل می آید که زنان هنوز مصئونیت اجتماعی و حقوقی نداشته و کاروان مجاهدت آنان به منزل نرسیده؛ اما درپچه های روشن امیدواری به روی آنان در حال بازشدن است.

**Roshan Sirran**

Roshan Sirran is widely recognized in Afghanistan and internationally as one of the leading voices for Afghan women's rights. Through various roles, she has 40 years of experience fighting for the rights of Afghan women; as an NGO leader, an advocate, an elected legislator, a municipal worker, an education director, a trainer, and a writer. Sirran has served as the Women's Advocacy Training Consultant for IFES' Support for Increased Electoral Participation (SIEP) program in Afghanistan for three years where she assists in program design and outreach, curriculum development, participant recruitment, and training. Ms. Roshan is the founder and Executive Director of Training Human Rights Association (THRA) for Afghan women, which is a leading non-political and non-profit organization working for Afghan women's capacity development. She has designed and implemented countless women's rights advocacy and outreach programs across the country, including complex face-to-face education and training of trainers programs. Sirran spoke

on the rights of women and interests of civil society leaders of Afghanistan at the Bonn 2 Conference in Bonn, Germany in December, 2011. She maintains a long history as an outspoken advocate on the national and international stage, advocating for women's rights at Afghanistan's formative traditional Loya Jirgas and speaking on struggles of Afghan women at events in 15 different countries. Her efforts have brought forth numerous civil society networks and organizations, including the Civil Society and Human Rights Network (CHRN), Afghan Civil Society Organizations Network for Peace (ACSONP), and the Free and Fair Elections Foundation of Afghanistan (FEFA).

**Mary Akrami**

Mary Akrami is the Executive Director of the Afghan Women Skills Development Center (AWSDC), the organization that established the first shelter for women at risk in 2003. Ms. Akrami envisioned an equitable and peaceful society through AWSDC and initiated the community based peace shuras (councils) in different provinces of Afghanistan. These peace councils became the only platform where women were able to find an opportunity to engage in conflict resolution mechanisms at the local levels and that was the start of women's inclusion in community based peace building. Ms. Akrami's organization has been working with other civil society organizations engaged in peace building and conflict resolution programs and provided them with trainings and mentoring on mechanisms on women's engagement in political and community based peace building. In additions to promoting women's contribution in the community based peace building and conflict resolution, Ms. Akrami has been engaged in advocacy and campaigning

for women's inclusion within the political and peace processes that included the 2010 Peace Consultative Jirga & the 2011 Grand Assembly for Peace Process. Because of her struggles for women's rights, Ms. Akrami received the International Women of Courage Award from the United States, Department of State in 2007. Ms. Akrami has participated in numerous international conferences and regional platforms for women in peace in Af-Pak region. Ms. Akrami is an alumni of New York University's Human Rights Advocacy Fellowship in New York, United States.

**Samira Hamidi**

Samira Hamidi has Master Degree (LLM) in International Human Rights Law and Practice from University of York, UK. Ms. Hamidi is a freelance consultant and women's rights activist. As freelance consultant, Ms. Hamidi has been carrying out research, evaluation, organizing trainings and advocacy events on women's rights, human rights and civil society issues. Previously she has worked as Program and Advocacy Director with Empowerment Center for Women (ECW) (2013), Country Director for AWN (2010-2012), Gender Coordinator with UNDP (2006-2009) and Deputy Human Resources Director with Ministry of Counter Narcotics (2004-2005). Ms. Hamidi has contributed towards women's rights agenda through her different roles and responsibilities since 2004. She has been able to focus on policy advocacy, contribute in strategic decisions of the organizations towards women's empowerment agenda, design and conduct conferences, trainings, workshops and advocacy events, participate in lobby initiatives at the national and international platforms. Ms. Hamidi was a member participant of National Peace Consultative Jirga in 2010 and Loya Jirga in 2011. Ms. Samira Hamidi was an elected civil society speaker to the Tokyo International Conference on Afghanistan in 2012. Ms. Hamidi is currently board member for Afghan Women's Network (AWN), Chair of the Human Rights Defenders Committee facilitated by the EU Delegation in Afghanistan and member of Steering Committee of Kabul House, (an initiative to support Women Human Rights Defenders) facilitated by Afghan Women Skills Development Center.

Capacity Building ON Policy Advocacy Workshop Education

The AWN's Capacity Building Officer Ms. Muska Meeran participated to the Capacity Building Workshop on Education Policy Advocacy. The objectives of this workshop were To strengthen the rights-based perspective of CSOs in Afghanistan in advocating for education and equip them with analytical tools to assert education as a human right; to share advocacy experiences and strategies of education; coalitions/networks in the Asia Pacific region and learn from the current advocacy work of ASPBAE; Update and engage the participants on the global commitments to education under the SDG4 (Education) and other SDG targets to inform their dissemination in communities; Strengthen the links among the CSOs in Afghanistan, Tajikistan, and Kyrgyzstan, and advocacy coalitions in the Asia Pacific region. In this workshop 12 participants consisting of four CSOs representatives from Afghanistan (three from ANAF AE, one from ACBAR, one from AWN and one from UNESCO), two from E-Net Philippines, and four from ASPBAE have participated.

6. Ms. Shafiq Habibi and Roshan Serina received less than 25 votes

Shafiq Habibi



Shafiq Habibi is one of the prominent women right activists, a professional and experienced journalist and a laureate TV and radio speaker. She has been also a skillful teacher in art of speaking, fluency and speech with five most important national awards, medals and sign of pride in journalism in five different regimes. She has also got the international award of IDA B.WELLS BRAVERY IN JOURNALISM in USA. Additionally Shafiq Habibi attained the prideful award of one of the (21 LEADERS FOR THE 21ST CENTRY), GALA, in New York City of USA in 21st May 2002, after the decision of jury team. She designed the projects for NAWA, which protects the rights of women and change the mentality of men to believe the dignity and liberty of women. From 2007, she produced 250 TV programs and 100 Radio programs and spots which were broadcasted by Afghanistan TV and Radios. Also NAWA implemented several awareness rising and advocacy programs in villages for men and women about violence against women.
